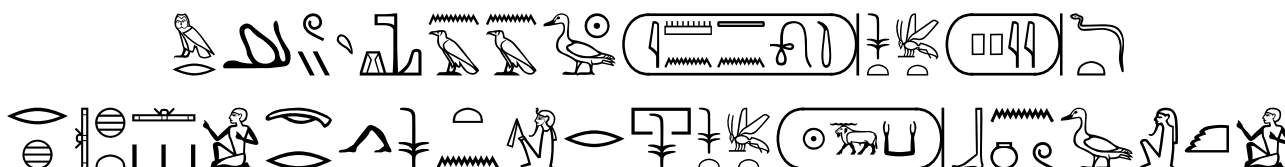

This project investigates Kmtyw ‘Black People’ philosophical conceptions of personhood, emphasizing the multiplicity of selves and their role in cultural, spiritual, and psychological life. Drawing on Classical Kmt ‘The Black Nation/Nation of Black

People’, Akan, Yorùbá, and other traditions, it contrasts Kmtyw ‘Black People’ understandings of the self with eurasian individualism.

2. Classical Kmt(yw) ‘Black People,’ Ma’at, and the Restoration of Black Identity

A long-term research program examining how the Kmt(yw) ‘Black People’ conceptualized themselves, defended their identity, and resisted eurasian incursions. It explores Ma’at as both a cosmological and sociopolitical principle and its relevance for Abibifahodie ‘Black Liberation’ today.

3. Abibitumi Architecture: Building Kmtyw ‘Black People’ Knowledge and Liberation Infrastructures

This project theorizes and develops the institutional and epistemological structures of *Abibitumi* (‘Black Power’) as both a Kmtyw ‘Black People’-centered worldview and praxis. It explores how digital-to-physical infrastructures (Abibitumi.com, Abibitumi Black Power Conferences, BlackNificent Books) advance language revitalization, cultural continuity, and Black autonomy. A central strand is the theorization of *Abibitumi Architecture and the Kmtyw ‘Black People’ Worldview*.

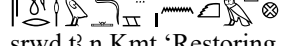
